good, pleasing and perfect will. Romans 12:1-2 **Urge:** Come alongside to help. Like a lawyer. In view of God's mercy: (found in 1-11) Two of God's Mercies are Love and Grace. The mercies of God are found in chapters 1-11: — offer of salvation (Rom. 1:16) — kindness toward those He saves (2:4; 11:22). — forgiveness of our sins (3:25; 4:7–8) — freedom from sin (6:18; 7:6). — right relationship with Him (5:10), — eternal life (5:21; 6:22–23) — resurrection of our bodies (8:11) — Holy Spirit who indwells us (Rom. 8:9, 11) and intercedes for us (8:26) ** In Christ we also have received the mercies of *faith* (mentioned thirty times in Romans 1–11), *peace* (1:7; 2:10; 5:1; 8:6), *hope* (5:2; 20 21) Offer you bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God. (vs. 1b) — Jesus was the only sacrifice who was willing to lay down his life. — It is impossible without supernatural help. This is true and proper worship: Is there anything in your life that you are NOT ready to give to God?
